## Learning Targets & Activities for the Week

- **The 7 Habits:** Begin with the End in Mind: I plan ahead and set goals. I do the things that have meaning and make a difference. I am an important part of my class and contribute to our mission and vision.
- **Reading**
  - ✓ Students are reading AR books of their choice; as well as, tracking their monthly AR progress. Did your child meet their September AR goals? Ask them or have them show you their AR record online.
  - ✓ Students are required to read at least 2 nonfiction books and at least one fiction book a month; as well as, earn 10 AR points a month.
  - ✓ We started our CIA Units. Mrs. Ingle's class is studying the book *Shiloh* by Phyllis Reynolds Naylor, and Miss Hwang's class started *Aurore of the Yukon: A Girl's Adventure in the Klondike Gold Rush* by Keith Halliday.
- **Math**
  - ✓ Students are actively working in groups to create math board games. Today they did a test run of their game with another group and next week they will make revisions before creating their final product.
- **Science – Water Unit**
  - ✓ Jessica Kinney from the Snohomish Conservation District taught students an interactive lesson about where water goes when it rains? Students modeled the movement of water from cloud to stream in different environments. Next students gathered and graphed data, and compared surface water runoff in forested areas vs. urban areas. In the next lesson, students will ultimately come up with solutions to prevent flooding during rainstorms.
