As a result, we promote a team approach that includes parents and community, and a high degree of meaningful collaboration around student learning.</p>	<p><u>Goal #1: Student Achievement</u> Math: At the end of each school year, the percentage of students who do not meet standard as measured by STAR Math (grades 1-5), and the Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) for Mathematics (grades 3-5) will decrease by 10%.</p> <p>Reading: At the end of each school year, the percentage of students who do not meet standard as measured by STAR Reading (grades 1-5), and the Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) for English and Language Arts (ELA) (grades 3-5) will decrease by 10%.</p> <p>Behavior: At the end of each school year, the number of student office disciplinary referrals as measured through conduct reports from ASPEN will decrease by 3%.</p> <p><u>Goal #2 Support for Learning</u> We believe in developing students' social abilities to empower them to be contributing citizens and lifelong learners.
